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#### **Executive Summary**

This document provides a comprehensive overview of the fully developed, GDPR-conform SP-EU project website incl. its knowledge hub. It outlines the site's structure, key content areas, and user experience features designed to effectively communicate the project's consortium members, news, events, publications, objectives, progress, and outcomes. The summary highlights the integration of visual elements, interactive components, and accessibility features to ensure broad stakeholder engagement. Overall, the document serves as a reference point for evaluating the website's functionality, design, and alignment with EU project visibility standards.

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#### 1. Overview and Scope

On 23 May 2025, the project website of SP-EU incl. its knowledge hub (https://social-prescribing.eu/) went online as part of work package 16. This advanced website replaces the interim one-page website, which was online since the beginning of the project.

The now fully operational website (<a href="https://social-prescribing.eu/">https://social-prescribing.eu/</a>) offers much more detailed information about the project. It includes key features for consortium members and interested researchers, as well as interactive sections tailored to patients, our 3 main target groups (LGBTIQ+community, refugees and first-generation immigrants, and elderly people living alone), the general public, healthcare professionals, decision-makers, and politicians.

Pages dedicated to disseminating the project's results include the *scientific publications*, *public deliverables* and *videos*, *blogs*, *links and downloads* pages within the dedicated *knowledge hub* section, the *news & events* section, and a newsletter sign-up feature under the *subscribe* section. In addition, as the project will start to generate more results, these will be added via a *key results* section already developed and set to go live once it will be filled with project content.

The website's language is targeted towards an educated but non-scientific general public, and its content will be updated with project news, upcoming public events, topical blog posts, new team members, downloads (such as the web-version of the project's info-brochure), key results, new publications, meetings for consortium members, videos and training materials on a regular basis as the project progresses.

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#### 2. Tour of the fully functional project website incl. knowledge hub

The new website was developed by concentris, and its content checked, edited and verified by the project's Dissemination, Exploitation and Coordination Stream, the Executive Board (EB) and the Project Management Office (PMO). In comparison to the initial one-page website, it consists of the following new pages and features:

A fully developed navigation menu with seven first-level items — About, Our Research,
Knowledge Hub, Key Results (will go live later in the project), News & Events, Contact and
Subscribe) — and several submenu items:

• The password protected internal area (intranet) is available to SP-EU partners from all consortium members. It serves as a central storage for SP-EU reference documents where confidential files can be exchanged safely. Moreover, it includes a progress monitoring tool with a reminder and notification function. The SP-EU intranet also contains a registration tool for project meetings as well as directory of all SP-EU partners to facilitate easy communication across the project. The SP-EU intranet went online on 01 January 2025. Individual logins including a manual were sent to all SP-EU partners after the remote kick-off meeting on 10 January.

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


Figure 4: SP-EU Intranet for consortium members.




Figure 5: Introductory landing page with most recent events and news.

Under the About section, there is detailed information about Our Vision, Project Facts,

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


Figure 8: Example page of an SP-EU consortium member within the "About" section.

Consortium Members, Management and SP-EU's Boards. The project partners are presented
collectively in form of an EU-map and list first (Fig. 7), and individually on separate pages,
including profile pictures, contact information, and a brief textual presentation of the
respective institute (Fig. 8).

#### **Upcoming SP-EU Meetings and Dates**

The Executive Board (EB) of the SP-EU consortium convenes frequently (approximately 4 times per year) in form of an online or face-to-face EB Meeting to discuss the overall progress of all work packages, make decisions on urgent topics, and outline the next steps. About once a year, the entire consortium (including PhD students, postdocs, and senior researchers working on the SP-EU project) congregates at a General Assembly (GA) Meeting.
